CRC Collaborates on Candidate School for Local Office Elections

CRC has undertaken a project in collaboration with The League of Women Voters of Topeka & Shawnee County, the Topeka Chamber of Commerce, and the Topeka-Shawnee County Public Library. The joint project is a creation of a Candidate School which helps potential political candidates run for local offices by educating individuals about how to succeed in local politics. Specifically, the school will address operations to help with a campaign, such as filing required reports and paperwork, basic election laws, fundraising, and marketing.

The event is scheduled for Tuesday, May 9th, from 6-8p at the public library. A second session will be scheduled after the first for the candidates who win their primaries. The session will take place in August, before the November 7th general election.
